Jeff Johnson is a land owner in the Mima Mounds corridor, a swath of privately owned prairies that are home to some very rare and unique species. He's lived on the prairie for about five years. In the few short years he's lived on the corridor, he said that Scotch Broom went from being just a few small plants to being "totally out of control". One of his neighbors suggested that he give us a call. I asked him had much changed since the work started? "Lots," he said, "for one thing, I can see the contour of the land again, and out here, the mounds are a big part of that. I can see the mountains again too."
